6 ISLAND PURE SHEEP DAIRY AND PRODUCE SHOP

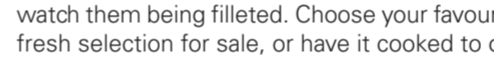

Food and Wine Events

KANGAROO ISLAND FARMERS' MARKET

The first Sunday of every month brings producers and their produce to visitors and the community at Penneshaw. The selection is seasonal and fresh, handmade and local. You might find local lamb and smallgoods, olive oil, organic honey, biodynamic eggs, freshwater marron, oysters, sheep cheeses and yoghurts, fig syrup, hand-made cordials, curry pastes, chutneys and relishes, local wine and old fashioned biscuits. Buy a coffee, taste some delights and take your time by the sea, 9am–1pm.

FOOD AND WINE EVENTS

Kangaroo Island celebrates its food and wine all year round and also hosts events, each with its own take on the Island's epicurean delights. Find out more about the Gourmet Gallop (January), Seafood Festival and Kangaroo Island Art Feast (October) and more at www.tourkangarooisland.com.au or the Kangaroo Island Gateway Visitor Information Centre.

Suggested Itineraries

Itinerary 1 Dudley Peninsula and American River ~ Allow approx 5-6 hours

From the township of Penneshaw, head along Cape Willoughby Road to **Dudley Cellar Door** (12), whose view is the perfect complement to a pizza and wine. The setting for **Chapman River Wines Cellar Door** (11), where the platters are to die for, is a different world, just behind the sandhills of pristine Antechamber Bay. Continue out to Cape Willoughby for a piece of Island history and majestic views. Back past Penneshaw, call into **Sunset Winery** (18) for plenty to taste in wine and platters and nearby **KI Artworks Gallery** at Baudin Beach which also has the Mary Beckwith memorial. Further along near Pelican Lagoon, MB Stoner Studio has glasswork you'll see nowhere else. At the narrowest point of the Island, Pennington Bay is graced by artwork signs made by local artists and school students, and the view from the top of Prospect Hill has many points of interest. The seafood at the **Oyster Farm Shop** (9) in the township of American River will top off the day.

Itinerary 2 Central and South Coast ~ Allow approx 6 hours

Start the day at Emu Ridge to sample **Rookery Wines & Kangaroo Island Ciders** (14) and the local art, and move on to **Clifford's Honey Farm** (2) to lap up a honey icecream. Head back along Starrs Road, and then south west along Birchmore Road, and pick up a lavender gift at **Kangaroo Island Lavender Farm** (8). Call in at Little Sahara for a different view and visit Vivonne Bay, once voted Australia's best beach. It's a short drive to the art gallery and cafe at **Rustic Blue** on the South Coast Road before retracing back to Harriet Road and heading north to **Andermel Marron Cafe & Two Wheeler Creek Wines** (1 & 17) for a marron treat and wine tasting. Last stop is the Roo Lagoon Gallery for its beautiful hand-made woodwork.

Itinerary 3 Kingscote and Surrounds ~ Allow approx 10 hours (or two shorter days)

Start the day with a coffee at **Island Beehive** (5) just out of Kingscote. Turn right towards Emu Bay for local painter, Shep's Studio, **Emu Bay Lavender's** (3) perfumed attractions and beautiful Emu Bay itself. The back roads return you to **Island Pure Sheep Dairy** (6) where cheeses and a tour await, and **Kangaroo Island Spirits** (15) for a fortifying taste or two. Head west to **The Islander Estate Vineyards** (13) (if you've booked ahead) and take a detour to Duck Lagoon, a good place to see koalas and enjoy a lazy picnic of Island produce. As you head back into Kingscote, **Ferguson Australia** (4) is waiting with a seafood platter and more. Turn right at Ayliffe Street and climb the hill to **Bay of Shoals** winery (10) for a tasting treat. Back in Kingscote there's plenty of local art to see at the two Fine Art Kangaroo Island galleries, **KI Gallery** and **Pete Nash Photography**. **Kangaroo Island Springs Road Vineyard** wines (16) can be tasted at Roger's in the main street and **KI Fresh Seafoods** (7) has some fillets ready for your dinner.

Take a trail to surprising places on wild and welcoming Kangaroo Island where you can taste the unexpected and wondrous in food and wine.

The Kangaroo Island Farm Gate and Cellar Door Trail introduces you to producers and products at their source. It invites you to enjoy the rich fruits of Kangaroo Island producers' labours in your own time in a natural unspoilt environment.

Farm gate and cellar door locations are listed separately. Each has its own specialities and personality.

The three listed itineraries cover three areas, each about a day's drive (but you're welcome to take two). The Dudley Peninsula, Central and South Coast, and Kingscote and Surrounds trails are a suggested guide to a variety of sensations and connections with locals. Choose your own, guided by the listed farm gate and cellar door venues, and mix in a splash of art, scenery and natural delights.

... and discover, food and wine at nature's pure heart

Kangaroo Island's food and wine industry takes its lead from the clean green environment in which it thrives. Nature's products as nature intended, or with a little help from a local, make for highly sought after fine gourmet foods and distinctive wines.

All the local establishments are small. Quantity is not the concern. These small industries flourish because of the quality of their produce: free-range eggs, olive oil, native berry jams, smoked fish, sauces and marinades, regional yoghurts and cheeses, freshwater marron, breads and biscuits. The Island is renowned for its honey, all of it produced from pure strain Ligurian bees. Quality and variety, fresh from the land.

The sea also yields its bounty: oysters, prawns, crayfish, whiting, snapper and garfish.

The food tunes into the seasons and nature, and much of this top quality produce is hard to find anywhere else.

Since Kangaroo Island was declared a wine region in 2001, 30 growers now tend 200 hectares of vines and produce 18 homegrown labels.

The temperate stable climate nurses the grapes to a long, slow ripening that develops strong varietal fruit flavours and intense colour in complex and distinctive wines.

Take a food and wine trail today. Unwind on a long, empty road to quality local produce, some of it unique to Kangaroo Island. Enjoy the taste, the view and the hospitality.

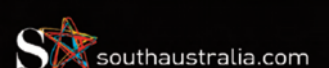
